Ronnie C. Chan – Chairman, Hang Lung Group Limited

Ronnie C. Chan is the Chairman of Hang Lung Group Limited and its subsidiary Hang Lung Properties Limited. Mr. Chan also co-founded the Morningside Group. In Hong Kong and mainland China, Mr. Chan is Chairman of the Executive Committees of the One Country Two Systems Research Institute and of the Better Hong Kong Foundation, Convenor of the Hong Kong Development Forum, a Vice President of the Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong. Mr. Chan is a Co-Chair of the Board of the Asia Society and Chairman of its Hong Kong Center, a founding Trustee of the African-Asian Society and a Director of the Board of the Peter G. Peterson Institute for International Economics.



Tony Chan – President, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology

Tony Chan is the President of Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Prior to joining HKUST, Professor Chan was Assistant Director of the U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF) in charge of the Mathematical and Physical Sciences Directorate. Professor Chan is an active member of many scientific societies, including the Society of Industrial and Applied Mathematics (SIAM), the American Mathematical Society, the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) and was selected as a SIAM Fellow in March 2010.



Victor K. Fung – Group Chairman, Li & Fung Group

Dr. Victor K Fung is the Group Chairman of the Li & Fung group, which comprises major businesses in Trading, Distribution and Retailing, and the Founding Chairman of the Fung Global Institute, a recently established independent think tank. He is a member of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference; vice chairman of China Centre for International Economic Exchanges of P.R. China; and Chairman of the Greater Pearl River Delta Business Council. He is also Honorary Chairman of the International Chamber of Commerce, headquartered in Paris, France. Previously, Dr. Fung served as Chairman of the Council of The University of Hong Kong, Chairman of the Airport Authority Hong Kong, Hong Kong representative on the APEC Business Advisory Council and Chairman of the Hong Kong Trade Development Council.



Ya-Qin Zhang – Corporate Vice President, Microsoft

As a Corporate Vice President of Microsoft, and Chairman of Microsoft Asia-Pacific Research and Development Group (ARD), Dr. Zhang is responsible for driving Microsoft's overall research and development efforts in China. He also serves on Microsoft Greater China Executive Management Committee. He was formerly Corporate Vice President of Microsoft, responsible for Microsoft's Mobile and Embedded Division in Redmond, USA and Managing Director of Microsoft Research Asia.
